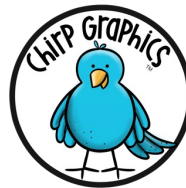

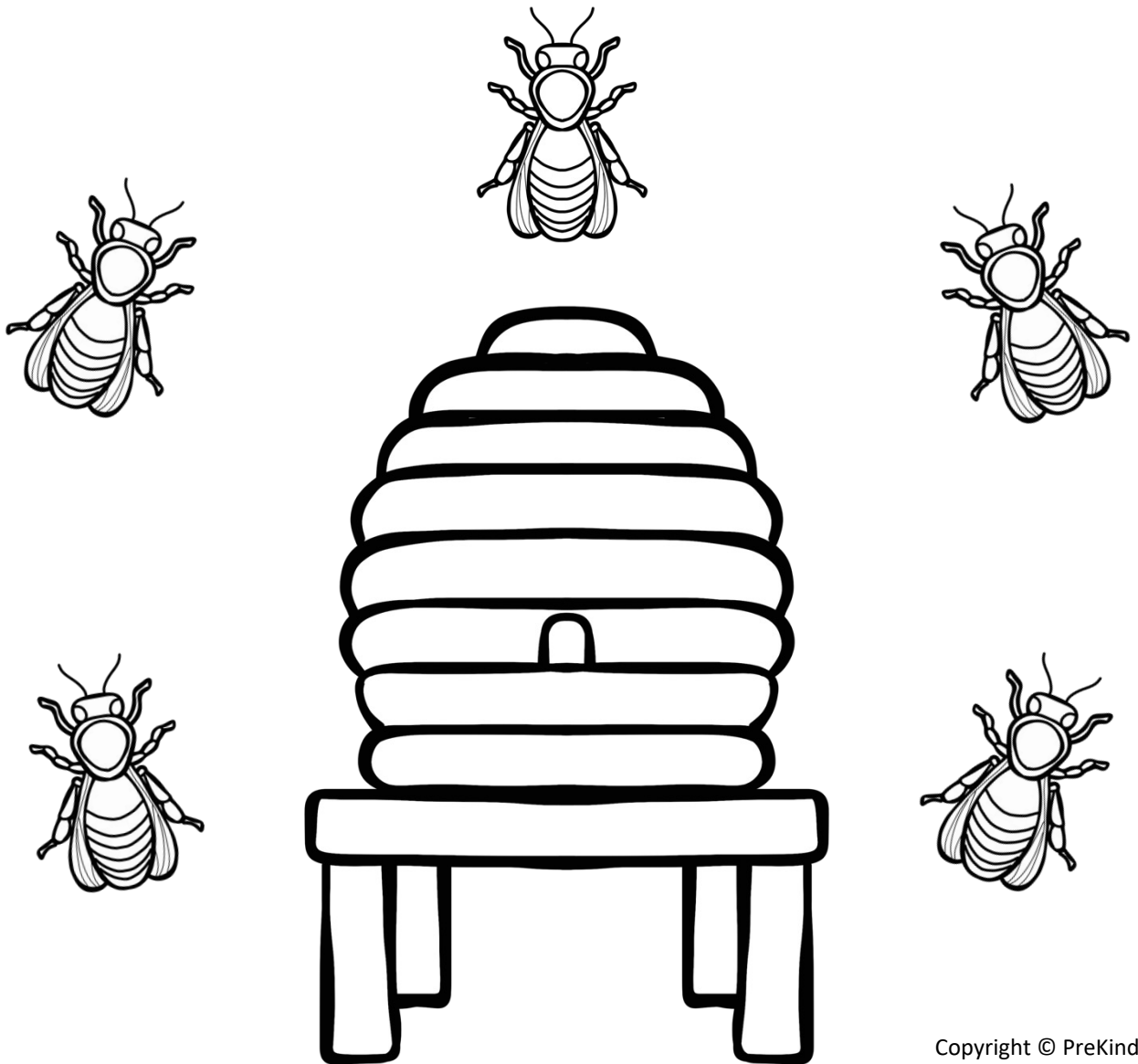

The great big mother piggy said.

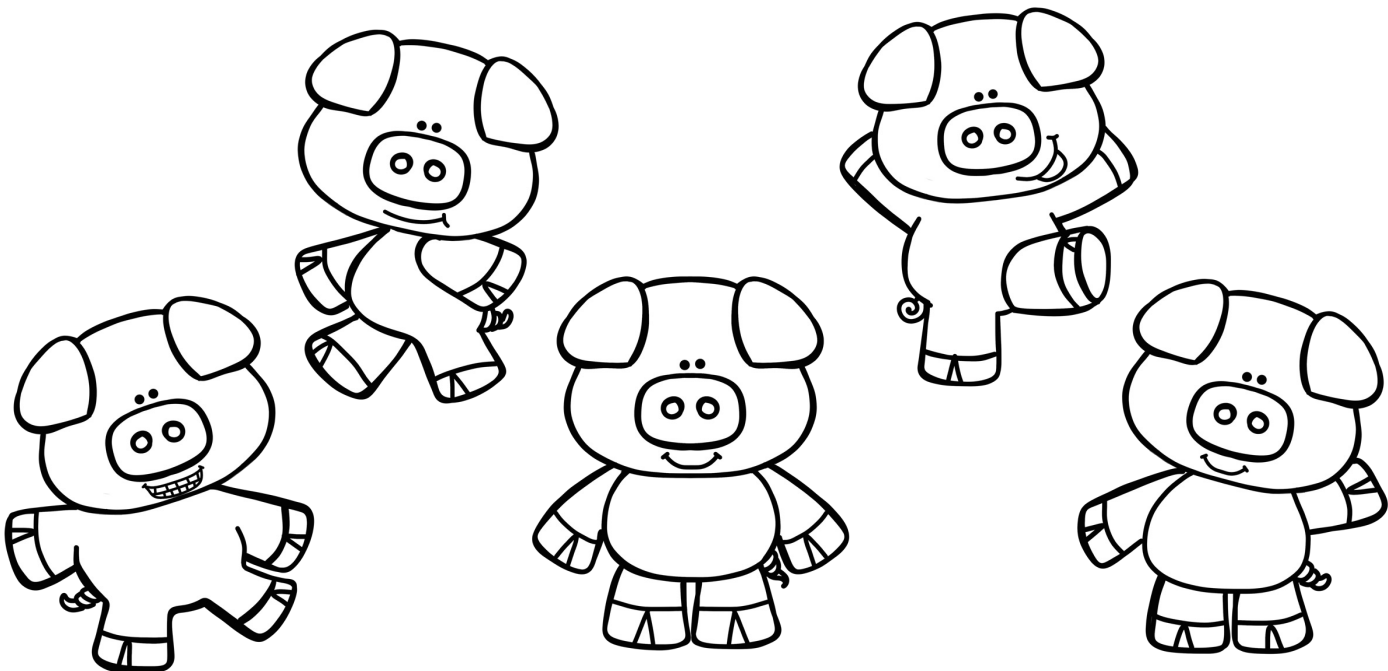
“So I will count them first to see

This little finger on the right.



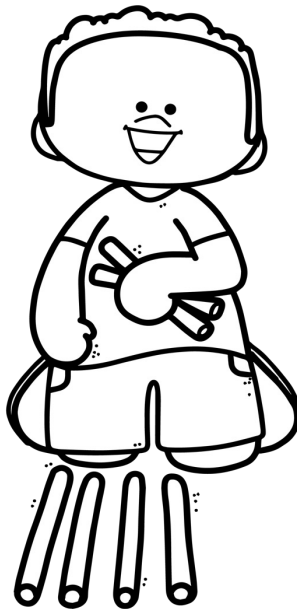
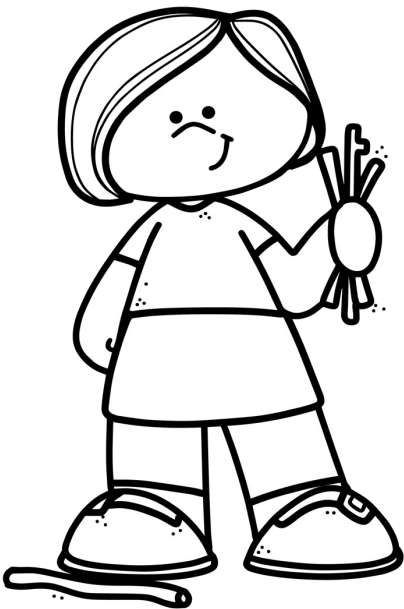
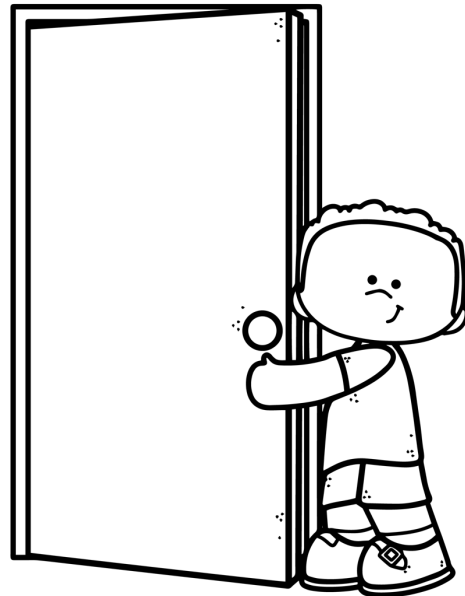
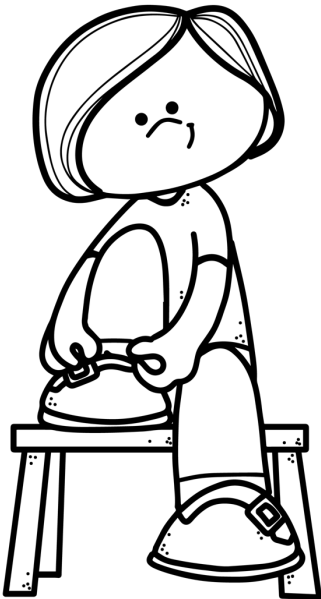

Nine, ten, a big fat hen.



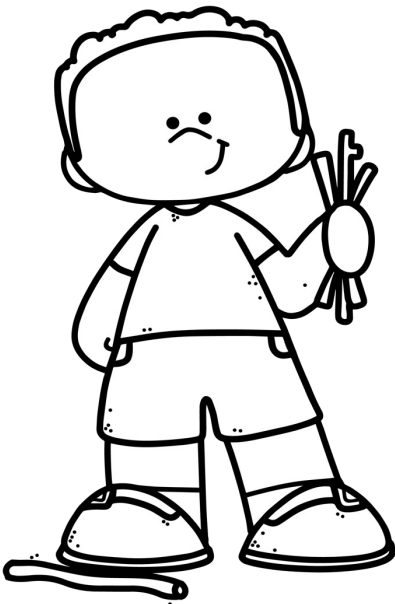
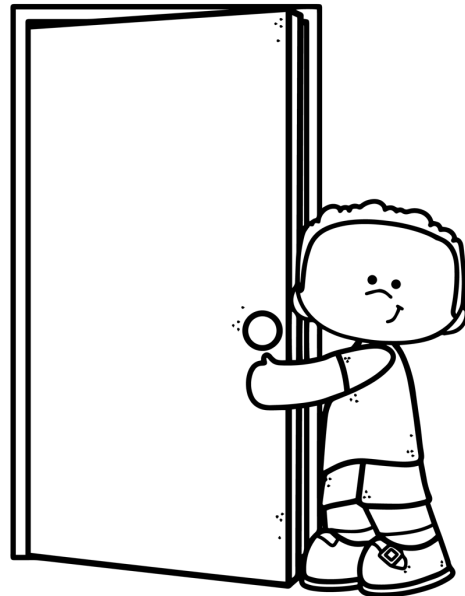

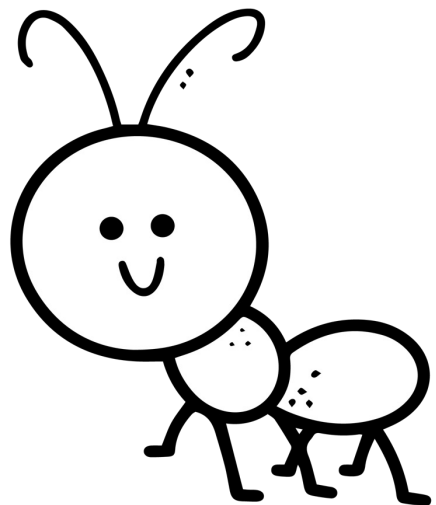


The Ants Go Marching

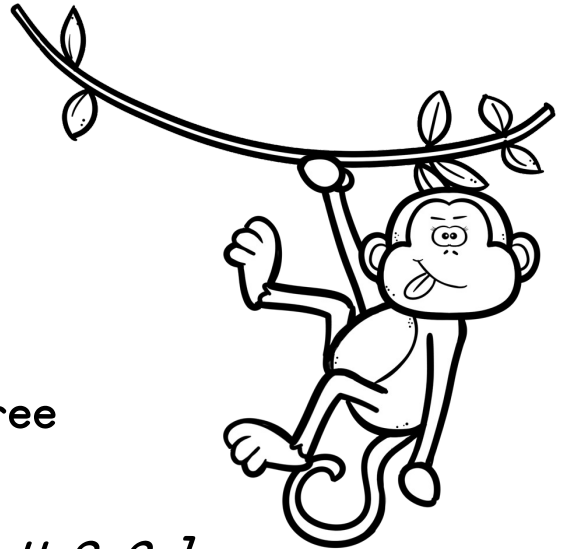

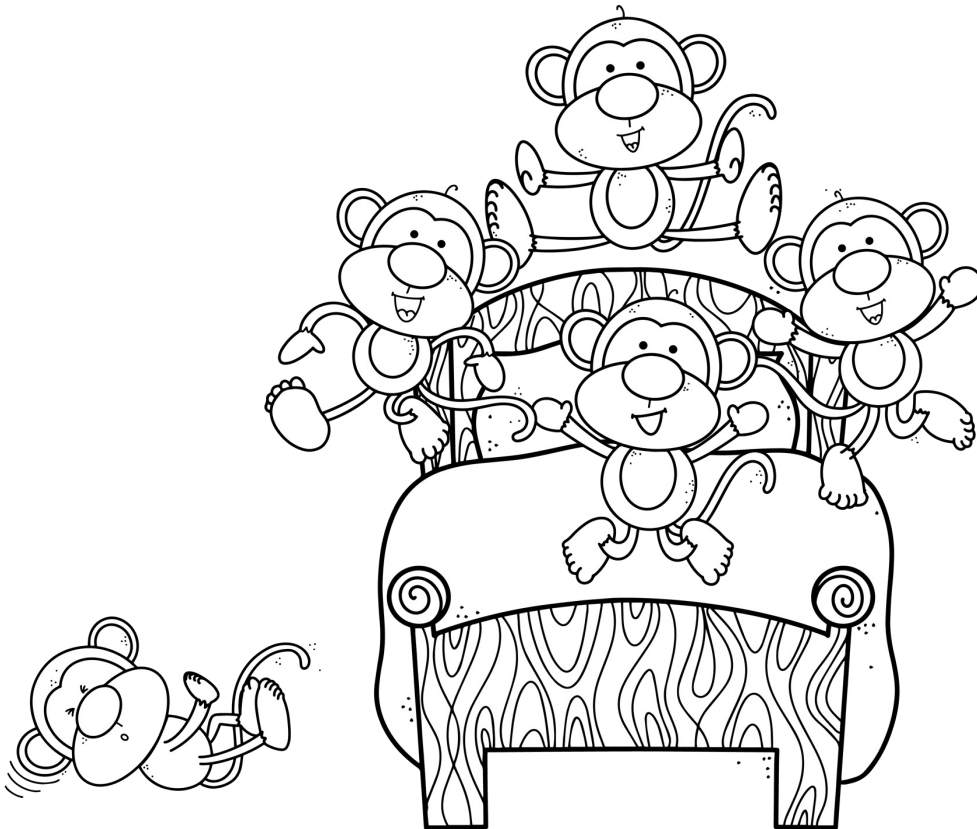

One got out of tune, and then there were three.

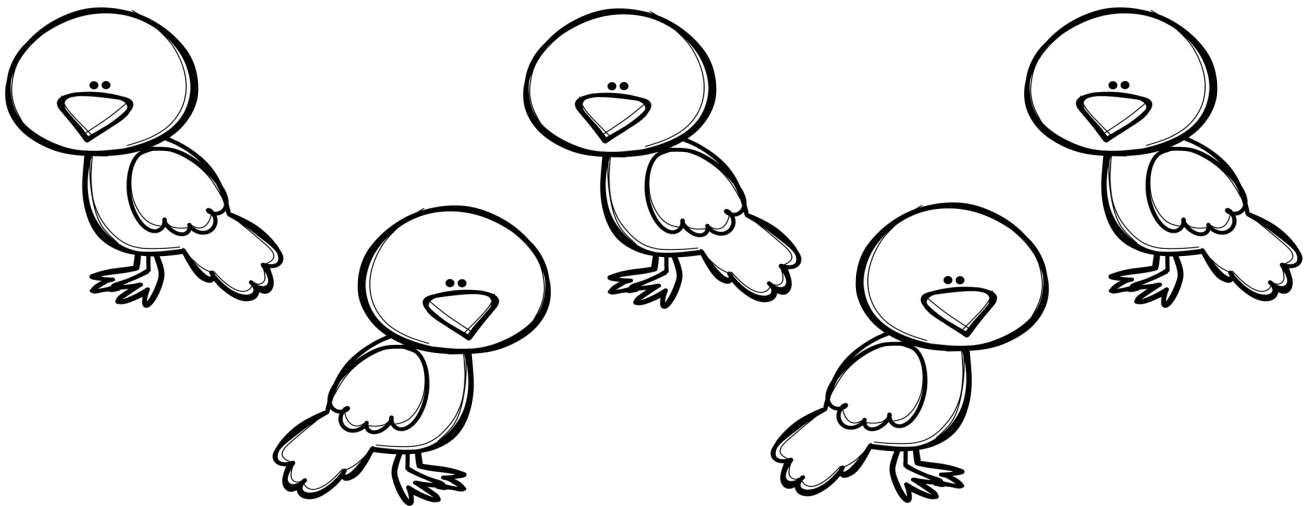
Three little blue birds, and what should one do,

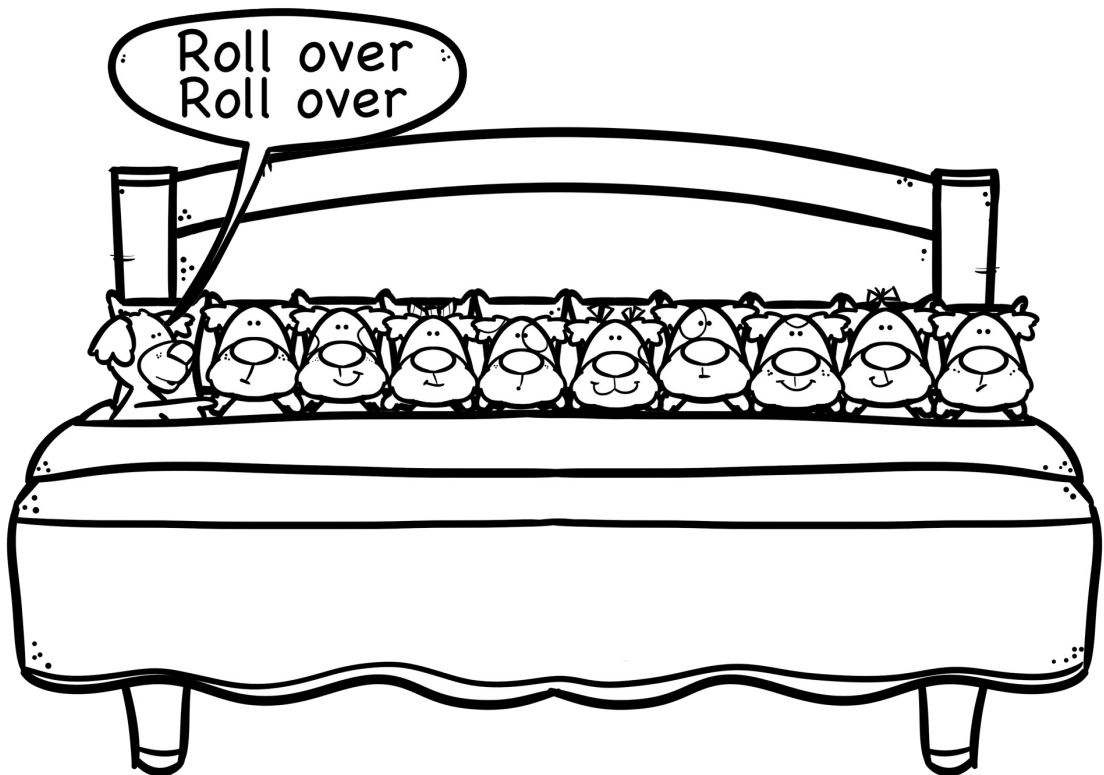


Ten in the Bed

“Alone at last! Good Night!”

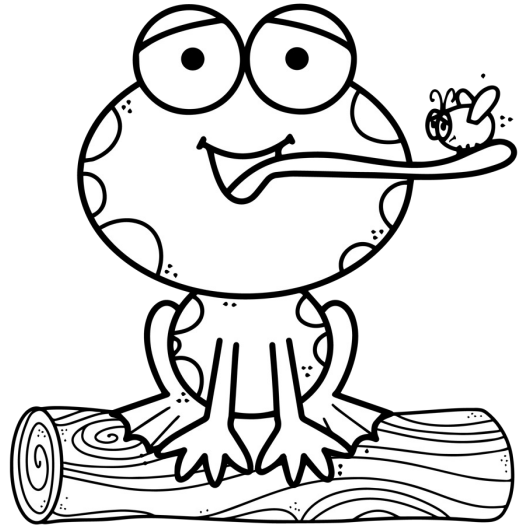


Five Little Frogs

Mother Duck said, "Quack, Quack, Quack, Quack," but only four little ducks came back.

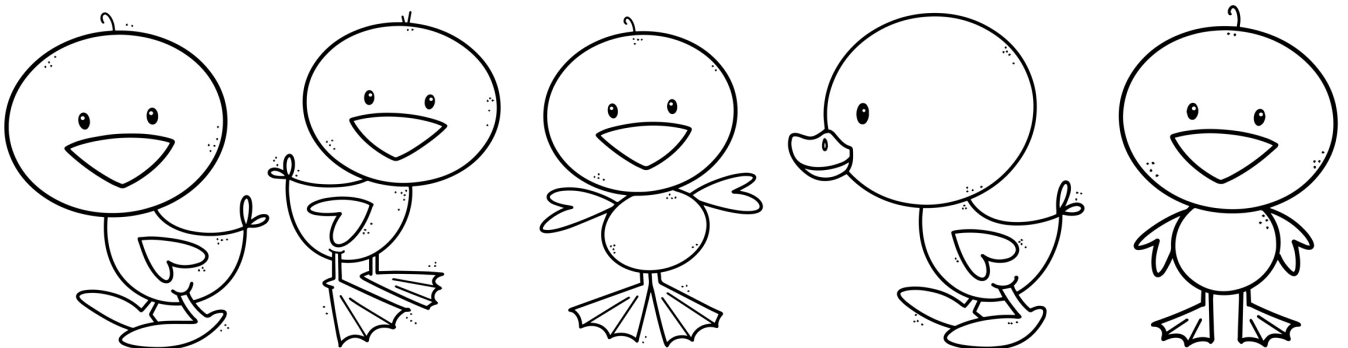
Four little ducks went out to play, over the hills and far away

The fourth one said,

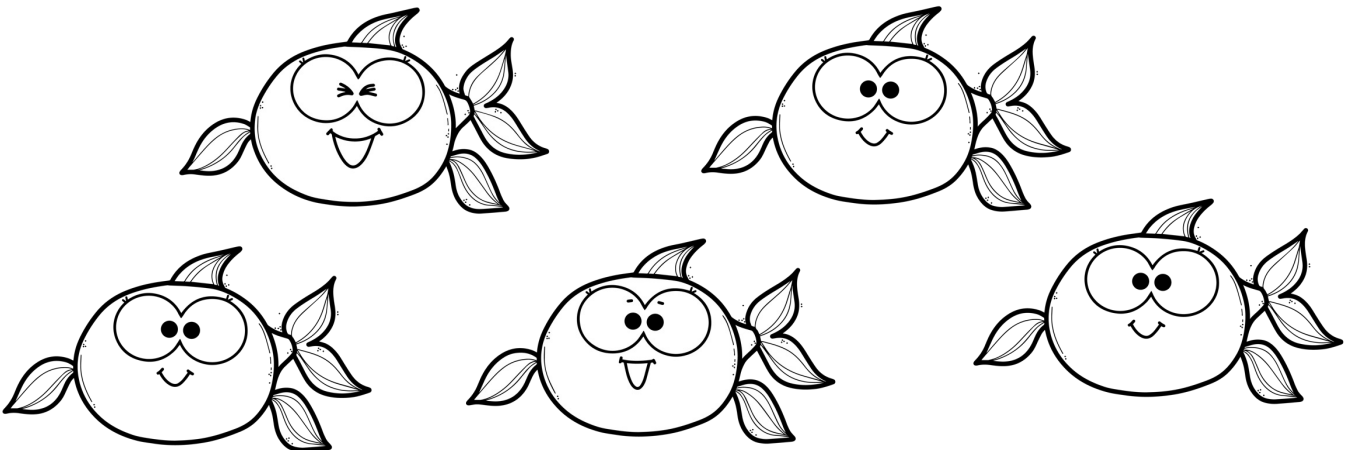
Let's dive and dip.

The second one said, "Let's rest awhile."

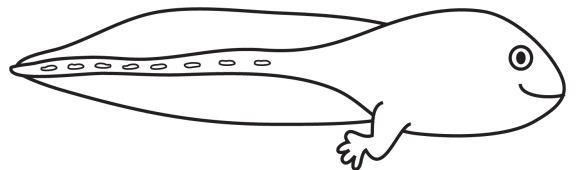
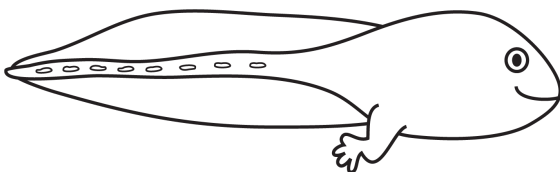
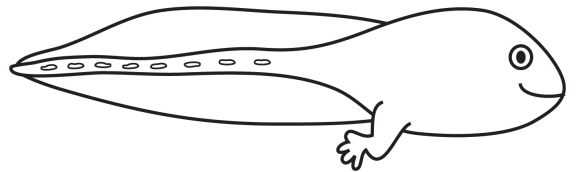
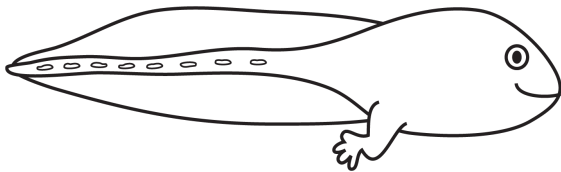
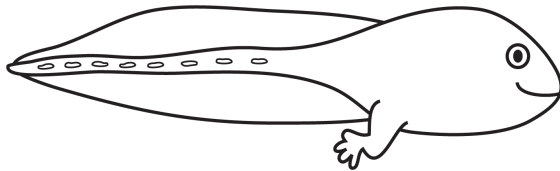
The third one said, "Swimming makes me smile."
