Use these posters for class discussions to talk to children about when they should report something to a teacher, when they should not report to a teacher, and when they should try to solve a problem.

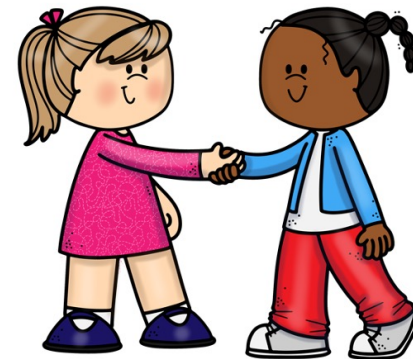

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Tips about Tattling

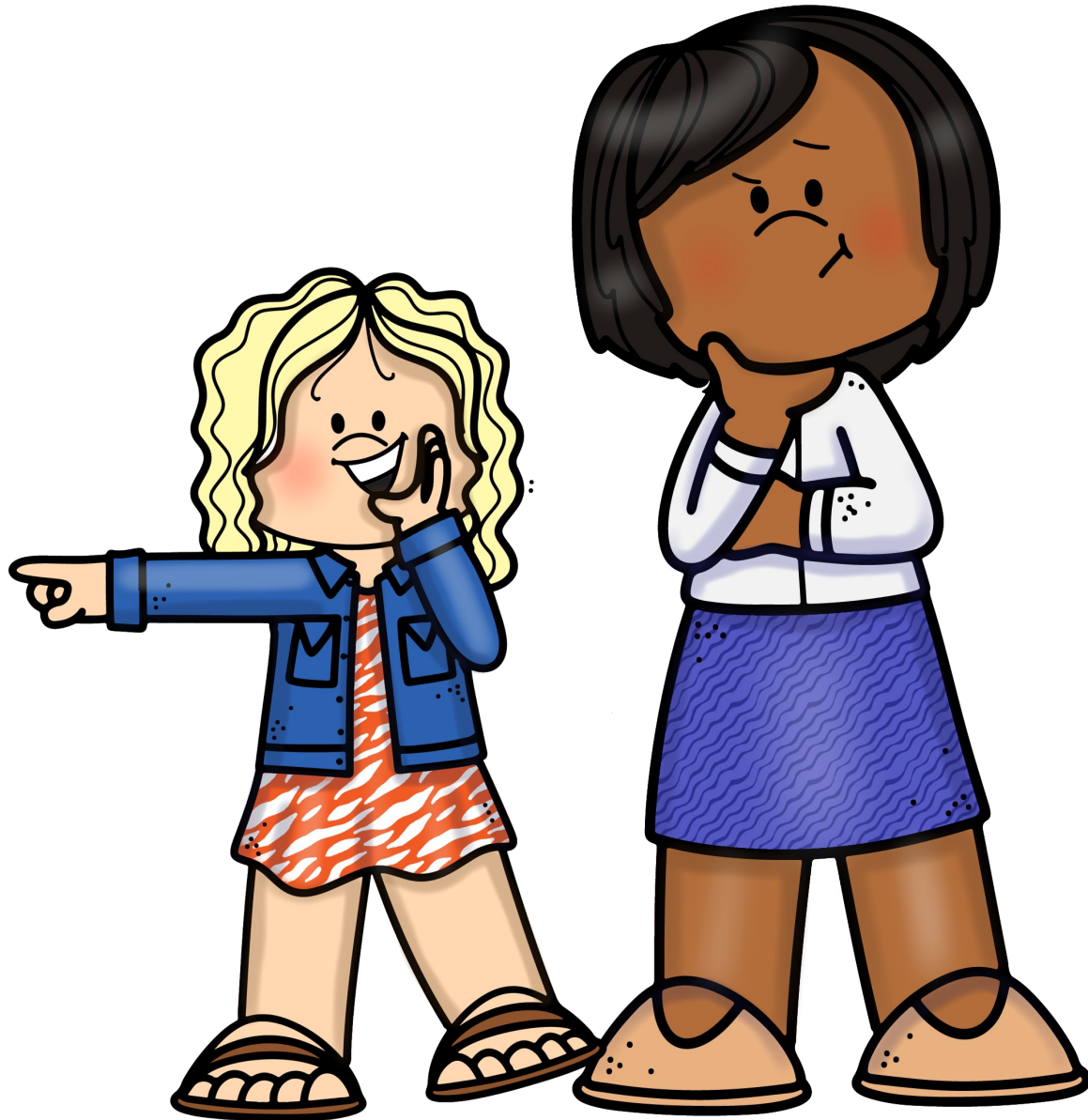
Realize that they *will* tattle.

Don't make a big issue about it when they do.

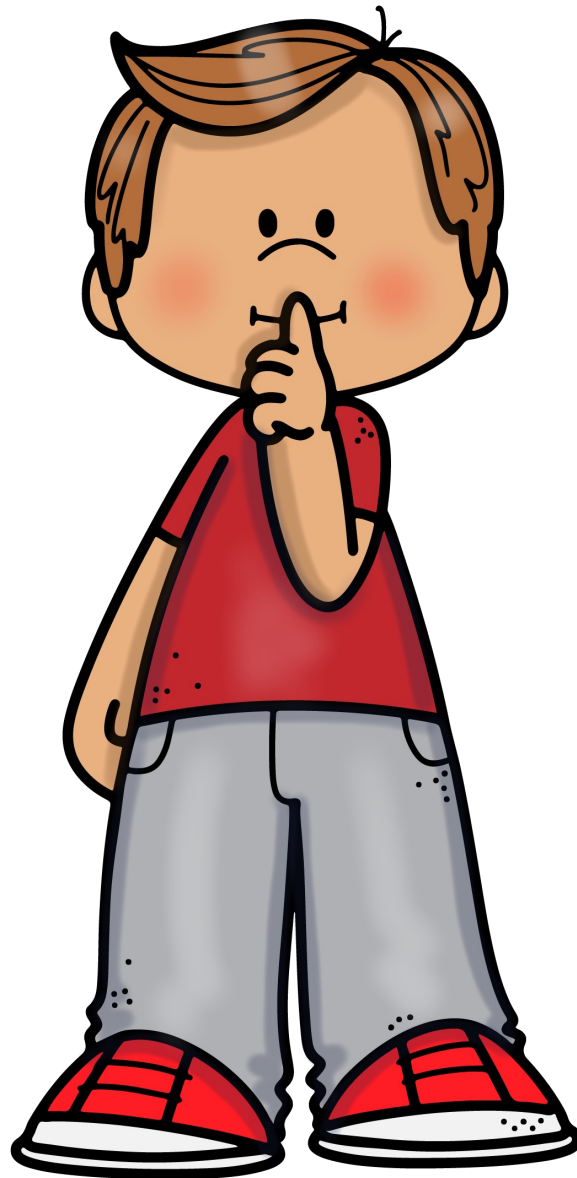
It is part of the child's process of learning self-discipline. They are learning the rules and are able to apply it to others before they can apply it to themselves.

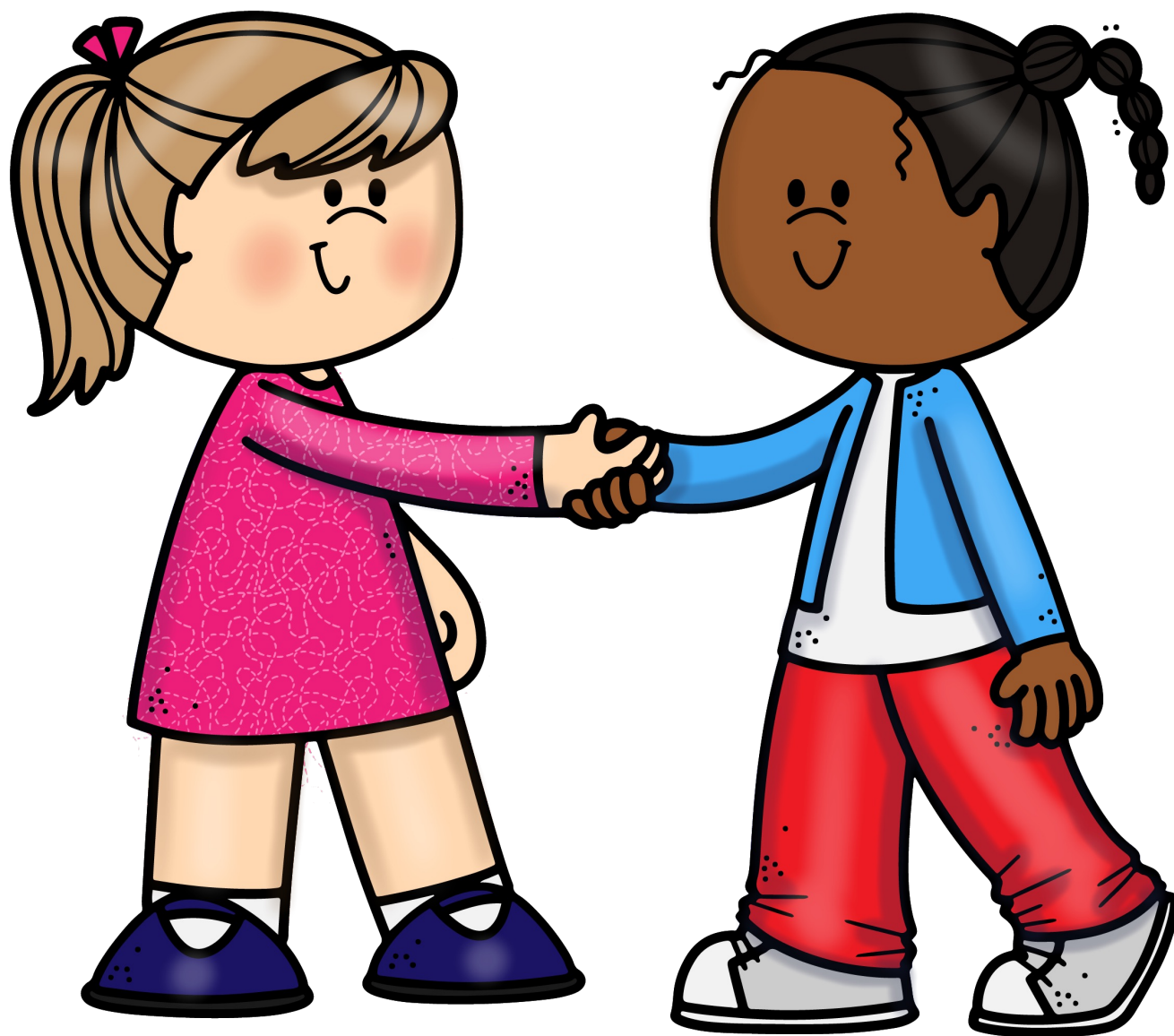

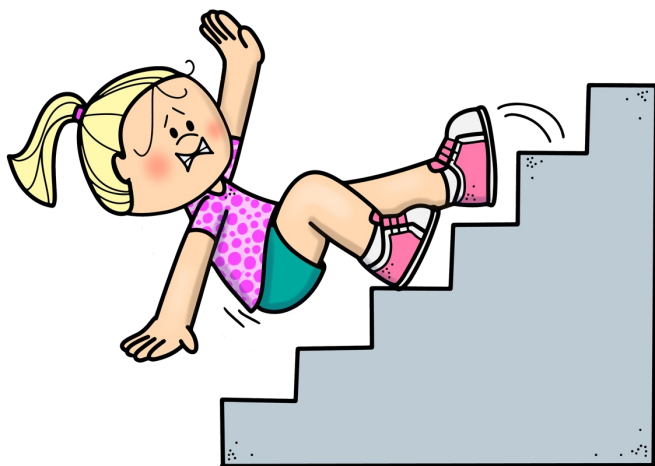

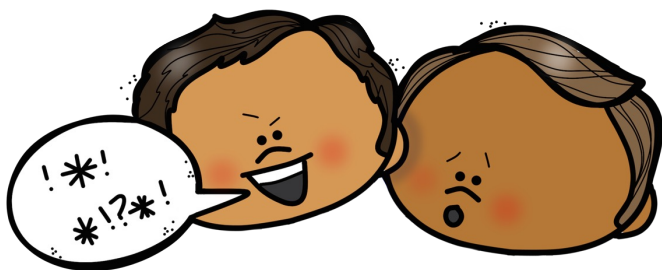
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
